Mascoutah High School takes a strong initiative to ensure the success of our students. We have developed a system through PBIS (Positive Behavior Interventions & Supports) called PRIDE.

Passion, Respect, Integrity, Determination, Education, or PRIDE, was founded to create a safe and productive learning environment for all MHS students.

This system allows faculty and staff at Mascoutah High School to offer incentives, rewards and activities in hopes of encouraging positive behavior in all students.

REWARDS, ACTIVITIES, AND INCENTIVES

One opportunity to recognize students who exhibit positive behavior is to distribute arrowheads, which is recognizable to their peers. These arrowheads give the students an opportunity to win prizes if their name is drawn
