Information from Your School Counselors

ACT:

If you missed registering for the October test, you have until **November 4th** to register for the **December 10th test date**. Please visit ACT.org for more information.

SAT + The Khan Academy:

This year all juniors will take the SAT test free of charge. In preparation for the test, students are strongly urged to visit the **Khan Academy** {www.khanacademy.org} website to prepare for the test. Through the Khan Academy, students are able to create their own personal account, answer questions that will in turn generate a unique educational roadmap specific to their needs, and begin working in the areas of English, writing and math to help improve their skill sets before starting practice tests. All students who are planning to take the SAT are encouraged to utilize this free test prep site to help prepare for the test. **Additionally, students who are needing help in certain subject areas (math, science, English & social studies) can create accounts and begin working on improving skills. This service is free just like the test prep, so sign up now and explore all of the subject areas the Khan Academy offers.**

Scholarships:

Please explore all tabs on the msd19.org website for scholarship opportunities including 'Scholarship Resources on the Web' link. This link will take you to many scholarship search engines that will allow you to search for nationwide scholarships. Again, once you log on to the msd19.org website, you will need to click on "About our School," then click on the "Counseling Office" and select the 'Scholarship Resources' tab. From there you will be able to search for community scholarships, general scholarships, and scholarships that are online. Currently, there are active scholarships under the 'Community/MHS' and 'General Scholarships' tabs. Foundations scholarships will not be active until mid January.

College and Career Planning:

If your student needs help choosing the right career path or college, then ACT Profile {www.actprofile.org} can help! ACT Profile is an interactive site where students are able to take three inventories (*interest, ability, and values*) that lead them to college and career clusters that they are able to further explore and gain relevant information from. The counselors encourage students to utilize their accounts and remember their logins and passwords, as this is the tool that will be used to help all grade-levels plan for their futures. Another great source for exploration of college and career planning is www.collegeboard.org. College Board Association is made up of over 6,000 of the world's leading educational institutions and is dedicated to promoting excellence and equity in education. Juniors will need to register for the ACT or the SAT on their own this year. Information was given to them at their registration meeting on January 28 including testing dates, timelines, and prices. Juniors will want to take a college entrance exam at least once before their senior year.

Senior Meetings:

All counselors will be meeting individually with seniors during the months of September & October. It will be at this time that we will discuss their responses to their senior survey, along with graduation credits, the ACT, college applications, scholarships, college representative visits, college fairs, financial aid, and letters of recommendation. Please expect a letter home in October that lists your student's current classes needed to fulfill graduation requirements, as well as an updated number of current graduation credits.

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FAFSA:

The FAFSA filing date has moved up to **October 1st**. The Counseling Office at MHS is having a Financial Aid night in the high school auditorium on **October 13th at 6 pm**. The presenter for October 13th will be **Valerie Jansen from St. Louis University**. Please plan to attend this meeting with your student if you have questions about FAFSA and the filing process. Additionally, on **October 20th**, the counseling office will host a FAFSA Completion Night at **7pm in the High School Library**. The October 20th night will focus on actually completing the filing process for FAFSA. Please bring your 2015 tax information, as well as other important documents needed to file. Obtaining your FSA Id along with your son/daughters FSA Id in advance is very helpful to the process. Go to fafsa.gov to get these.

PSAT Test:

On **Friday, September 9th**, the counselors visited all tenth grade honors English classes, as well as **all** junior English classes, to handout information regarding the PSAT. **The deadline to sign-up for the PSAT is Friday, September 30th**. The cost of the test is **\$30**. The PSAT will be given to those students who sign up on **Wednesday, October 19th during 1st through 4th hours**. More information to come.
