IDENTIFICATION CARDS

Student IDs are issued once yearly at no cost to the student. The purpose of the student ID is to provide a safe, secure, and educationally sound learning environment. The ID will act as the student's identification, library card, and cafeteria card. All students MUST display their ID around his/her neck and on the outside of his/her clothing at ALL times during the day while on school property. If you have misplaced/forgotten, lost, or defaced your ID, there will be \$5 charge for a new ID. Students will not be able to 'borrow' a school ID.

Information from Your School Counselors

Senior Meetings:

All counselors will be meeting individually with seniors during the month of September and October. It will be at this time that we will discuss their responses to their senior survey, along with graduation credits, the ACT & SAT, college applications, scholarships, college representative visits, college fairs, financial aid, and letters of recommendation. Please expect a letter home in October that lists your student's current classes needed to fulfill graduation requirements, as well as an updated number of current graduation credits.

FAFSA:

The FAFSA filing date is **October 1st**. The Counseling Office at MHS is having a Financial Aid night for senior parents in the high school auditorium on **September 19th at 6:00 pm**. Additionally, FAFSA Completion Night will be held at MHS in the Library on **October 10th at 6:00 pm**.

ACT:

If you missed registering for the September test, you have until **September 22nd** to register for the **October 28th test date.** Please remember, Mascoutah High School is a testing center for the October test date. Please visit <u>ACT.org</u> for more information.

SAT + The Khan Academy:

This year all juniors will take the SAT test free of charge. In preparation for the test, students are strongly urged to visit the **Khan Academy** {www.khanacademy.org} website to prepare for the test. Through the Khan Academy, students are able to create their own personal account, answer questions that will in turn generate a unique educational roadmap specific to their needs, and begin working in the areas of English, writing and math to help improve their skill sets before starting practice tests. All students who are planning to take the SAT are encouraged to utilize this free test prep site to help prepare for the test.

Scholarships:

Please explore all tabs for scholarship opportunities including 'Scholarship Resources on the Web' link. This link will take you to many scholarship search engines that will allow you to search for nationwide scholarships. Keep checking for scholarships! More will be added as the year continues.

College and Career Planning:

If your student needs help choosing the right career path or college, then ACT Profile {www.actprofile.org} can help! ACT Profile is an interactive site where students are able to take three inventories (*interest*, *ability*, *and values*) that lead them to college and career clusters that they are able to further explore and gain relevant information from. The counselors encourage students to utilize their accounts and remember their logins and passwords, as this is the tool that will be used to help all grade-levels plan for their futures. Another great source for exploration of college and career planning is www.collegeboard.org. College Board association is made up of over 6,000 of the world's leading educational institutions and is dedicated to promoting excellence and equity in education. Juniors will need to register for the ACT or the SAT on their own this year. Information was given to them at their registration meeting on January 28 including testing dates, timelines, and prices. Juniors will want to take a college entrance exam at least once before their senior year.

Information from Your School Counselors

PSAT Test:

During the month of September, the counselors will be visiting all tenth grade honors English classes, as well all junior English classes, to handout information regarding the PSAT. The deadline to sign-up for the PSAT is Friday, September 28th. The cost of the test is \$30. The PSAT will be given to those students who sign up on Wednesday, October 10th during 1st through 4th hours (7:45 am-11:35 am). More information to come. For Juniors, this test is the qualifying test for the National Merit Scholarships. Other grades are welcome to take the test for practice, but the National Merit Scholarships are reserved for juniors only.

AP Dual Credit (1818):

Ms. Frey will visit AP classrooms on Wednesday, Sept. 12 and Thursday, Sept. 13th to speak to students about dual credit offered through the 1818 program at St. Louis University. Students enrolled in AP US History, AP European History, AP Calculus, AP Literature/Comp, or AP Chemistry and have a 2.5 GPA or higher are eligible to enroll in dual credit through the 1818 SLU program. Next semester, SLU will also offer dual credit for the PreCalculus and Hon PreCalculus class. Ms. Frey will be back in the AP classrooms to register students for dual credit on September 19th and 20th. Please contact Ms. Frey with any questions regarding the program or the enrollment process.


